The Bearcats started out in the third inning like champions and before the final out was made they piled up three runs with the assistance of two errors, a walk and a sacrifice.

"Tuffy" Irvin blew up in the fourth, walked two men and made a balk and with the assistance of two errors and a hit the visitors put four men across the pan. Willamette got two more runs in the fifth, when the Stanford pitcher walked the first two men who came to bat and Page brought both men home with a hit through short.

Stanford also chalked up one in the fifth when Wayland was walked and came home when Kellan slammed out a two-bagger to left field. Stanford scored again in the sixth on two walks and a couple of sacrifices.
