Second Hand Store on
Commercial Is Entered

The second hand store of J. A. Rowland, 444 North Commercial street, was broken into some time on Thursday night, and an investigation Friday morning showed that the thief had made away with four pairs of shoes. The robbery was investigated by Officer Morelock, who found that the thief had entered the building by removing a casing from a side door, after an unsuccessful attempt to "jimmy" open a window.

John Marr, of the merchants' patrol service, heard some one inside of the store and summoned Officers Victor, J. F. White and W. J. White, who searched the vicinity but the thief had made good his escape before their arrival. Thieves also entered the Steinbock second hand store, three doors south of the Rowland store, but the police found there was nothing missing when they investigated the affair Friday morning.

What is thought to have been an attempt to enter the home of W. H. Dancy, 369 North Liberty street, was investigated by Chief of Police Welsh Friday morning. Little indication that there had been anyone in the home was found and there was nothing missing.
