Facts About the Catholic Church

Supposing that all have the Bible, all have a faithful translation and all can read it. Still it cannot be the rule of faith, especially under individual interpretation, because private interpretation of the Bible is most fallible and has been the fount of all sorts of heresies and even blasphemous doctrines. In the world today there are hundreds of denominations, sects or churches, and I suppose all are sincere in saying the Bible is their guide and teacher. Are all of them true churches? This is an impossibility, because truth is one, even as God is one, and there can be no contradiction. All these churches say that the Bible if read aright and prayerfully is sufficient and will guide the individual aright. And all say they read it aright. Now we do not question their sincerity any more than we would question the sincerity of a child who is taught by his instructor that two and two equals five. They have imbibed false principles. Let us suppose: Here is an Episcopalian minister, a sincere, honest, well-meaning and prayerful man. From his reading of the Bible he says it is clear that there must be Bishops, for without Bishops there can be no priests, and without priests, no sacraments, and without sacraments no church. The Presbyterian minister—a sincere, honest, well-meaning and prayerful man also, says there should be no Bishops but only Presbyters. "Here is the Bible in proof," says the Episcopalian, and "Here is the Bible to give you the lie," says the Presbyterian. Then the Baptist comes in. He is well-meaning, honest and also prayerful. "Have you ever been baptized?" asks the Baptist. "I was," says the Episcopalian, "when I was a baby." "And so was I," replies the neighbor, "when I was a baby." "But," says the Baptist, "it was done by sprinkling, and that is no baptism at all." And he gives the Bible for proof of it. Just then a Unitarian comes in; an honest, sincere and well-meaning man. "Allow me to tell you," he remarks, "that you are a pack of idolaters; you worship a man for a God who is no God at all," and he turns to several texts in the same Bible to prove his contention. The next one to get into the argument is a Methodist. Honest, sincere, well-meaning and prayerful. "Did you ever FEEL religion?" he asks. "The Spirit of God moving within you?" "Nonsense," says the Presbyterian, "we are guided by our reason and judgment." "Well," says the Methodist, "if you never FELT religion you never had it, and will go to hell for all eternity." Just here the Universalist, producing his texts from the Bible, says: "You are a strange set of people; do you not understand the Word of God? There is no hell at all. That idea is only good to scare old women and children." Another chimes in right here, "Baptize the men and let the women alone; for the Bible says 'unless a MAN be born of water and the Holy Ghost, he cannot enter into the kingdom of heaven.'" "So," says he, "the women are all right, but baptize the men." Then the Shaker speaks up and says, "Do you not know that the Bible tells you to 'work out your salvation in fear and trembling' and you do not tremble at all. My brethren, if you want to go to heaven, SHAKE, my brethren, SHAKE." All this may be somewhat amusing, but at the same time it is pitiful, for the average Protestant is sincere, honest, well-meaning and prayerful. But, can they all be right?
