Agreement Reached on Proposed Bird Refuge

Through an agreement that has been reached between the proponents of the Roosevelt bird refuge in Malheur lake and the irrigation interests, passage of the initiative measure to make Malheur lake a bird refuge is believed to be assured. The completed amended petition was filed with the secretary of state yesterday by W. S. Baker of Portland, vice president of the association, and today will be sent to Attorney General Brown for ballot.

Before the agreement was reached by the contending interests the first petition had been filed with the secretary of state. Recently at a conference in Portland it was found that a slight change in the wording would protect the irrigationists, as well as give the bird refuge proponents what they desired. An amended petition was then prepared and the original withdrawn.

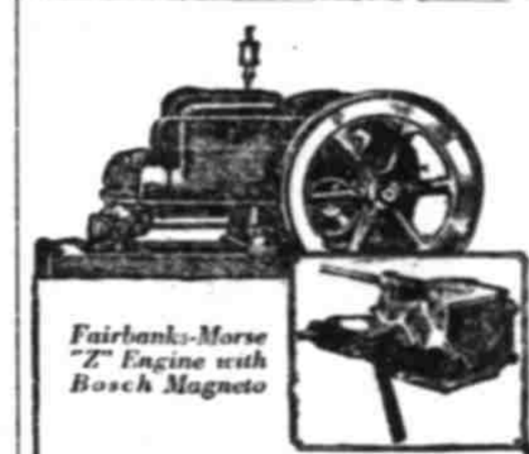
