

Lumber Orders Heavier Than for Previous Week

Lumber orders for the week ending June 5 were materially heavier than for the previous week. The average of new business per mill was 160,343 feet, as against an average of 137,790 feet for the last week in May. Production, at \$4,986,700 feet for 127 reporting mills, shows a lowering tendency. Due to abnormal stocks, resulting from car shortage and seasonal trade conditions. By reason of car shortage, the unshipped balance of business for rail delivery shows a marked increase. Rail shipments totaled 18,570,000 feet; local deliveries, 2,916,147 feet; The total of all unshipped business at reporting mills, is 255,466,205 feet.

Religious Liberty Is Subject Treated by Evangelist Bell of Salem

"Religious liberties is not a matter of minorities or majorities. It is not a matter of policy. Religious liberty is a matter of rights and principle, and rights and principle are not matters subject to legislation. Rights are not made. They do not come to men because of conditions through circumstances. They are an endowment by the Creator, and belong alike to all men."

Thus spoke Evangelist A. R. Bell of Salem, Thursday evening at the camp of the Adventists. He said that this country was born in the providence of God and the fulfillment of prophecy. He said that "the nation in its very formation took account of the individual, and in the matter of human rights counted him supreme." He declared that "men seem to have forgotten the past, and we are living in a day when the church, shorn of her glory and power because of her unfaithfulness turns to the state for help. Instead of storming the throne of grace for Holy Ghost power, she is found sending her petitions to the halls of legislation."

The Evangelist, who is secretary of the Religious Liberty Association of the state of Oregon, warned his hearers against the encroachment of the church in matters of conscience, and bade them watch closely the efforts of the church and other organizations whose sole purpose seems to be to have the states and the national congress committed to Sunday legislation.

Last night Elder A. R. Ogden of Walla Walla, spoke on the Sabbath question, answering the question, why Seventh Day Adventists keep Saturday instead of Sunday. He showed from the Bible and history

...the seventh day Sabbath came into being from Christ's day, and on into the fourth century, and beginning with the Sunday law of Emperor Constantine and later by the church of Rome was displaced by the Sunday institution. Several standard Catholic works were read by the speaker in which was stated in positive language that the church changed the day.

A tremendous audience gave strict attention. The biggest crowd yet is on the campground to stay till the finish. The last day of the camp is tomorrow. Today they will observe their Sabbath.

The last service of the campmeeting, the 8 o'clock service, will be in charge of L. R. Dixon of Portland. His subject will be, "The Climax of Human History—Is Armageddon Past or Future? Has The Last War Been Fought?"

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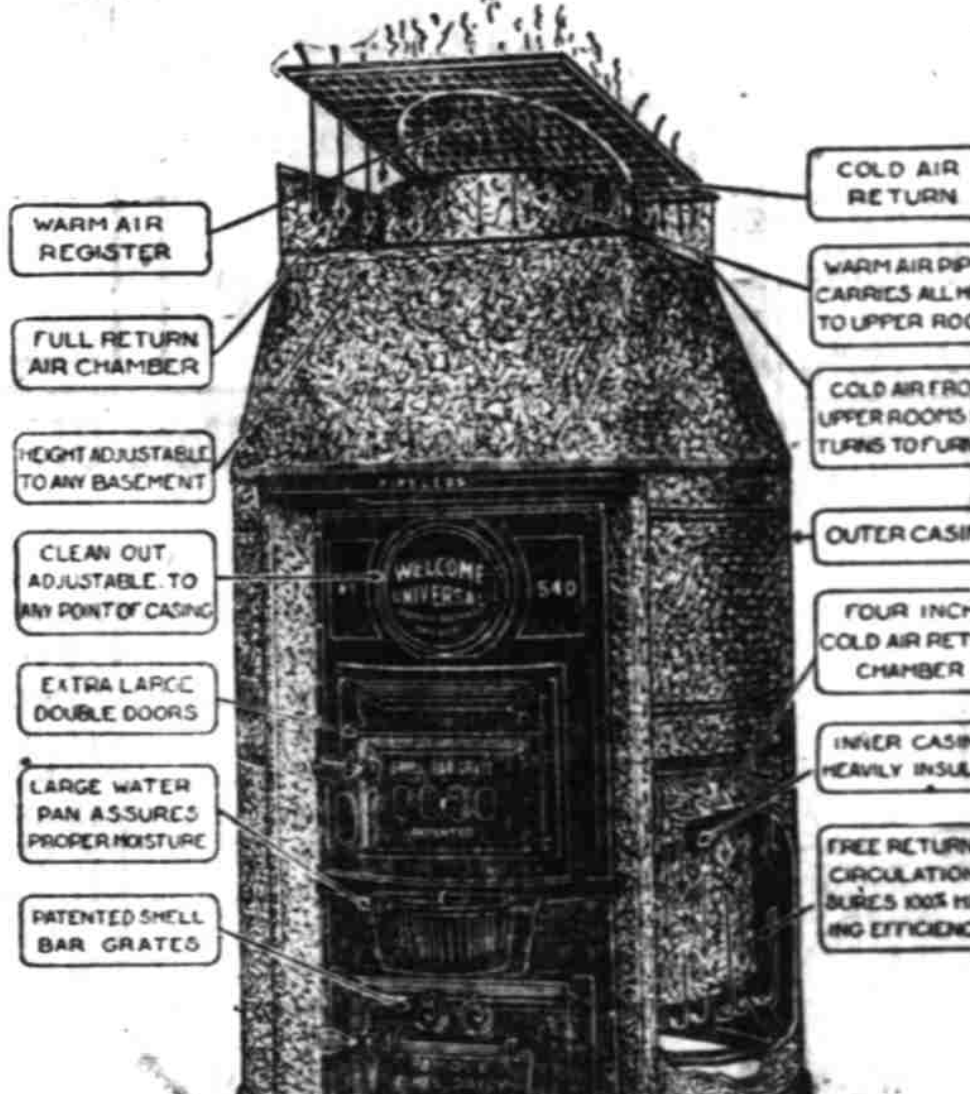
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
