Basave Denies Knowledge Of Carranza's Death

MEXICO CITY, June 12.—General Basave Pina denied today before the federal court which is investigating the death of the late President Carranza that he had received from General Alvario Obregon authority to order the capture of Carranza, insisting he did it on his own responsibility.

General Rodolfo Herrero had previously testified that he had received his orders from General Pina, acting for General Obregon.

In a manifesto which he terms his last words to the Mexican people,

Pablo Gonzalez today denies any connection with the death of Carranza and denounces the suggestion that he, retired from the presidential race because he was bought or feared defeat, declaring it was because he wished to avoid armed conflict. "In our country, unfortunately, it has been impossible to organize real political parties formed and sustained on the basis of principles instead of personalities," Gonzalez says.

BOLSHEVIKI ADVANCE.

WARSAW, June 11.—Russian Bolshevik cavalry engaged in the drive southwest of Kiev, designed to encircle that city, has cut the railroad

between Kiev and Berditchev at several places and has pierced the Polish front lines at various points, according to news from the front. The soviet forces are reported to number from 20,000 to 40,000 strong and 5000 cavalrymen.

This leaves the Poles with but a single line of railroad to Kiev. In addition, the Kiev-Korosten line is threatened by a division of Bolshevik which has crossed the Dniester river north of Kiev.

Heavy fighting continues on both sides of the city, and infantry is in action all along the front.
