SAN FRANCISCO, Junp 15.-Whether "Jack" Dempsey must face face trial tomorrow on a charge of conspiracy to evade the selective draft act will be determined tomorrow morning, Colonel hCarles W. Thomas, asistant United States district attorney, said tonight. Dempsey today was acquitted on a charge of evading the draft act. Jack Kearns, his manager, is indicted with him on the conspiracy chrage and on conclusion of Dempsey's trial to-
