Possibly New Strawberry

The Misses DeGuire, living at 337 North Commercial street, have a strawberry growing in their yard that may be a new variety, and if it is it will be well worth propagating. The plants have come up without any effort or previous knowledge of the Misses DeGuire, and apparently from seeds dropped there. They are vigorous growers and the fruit is very large, firm, highly colored and of delicious flavor. Just start enough to be a good canner. Some expert strawberry grower should examine them and give them a name, and if they are a new variety, assist in getting them well started. They resemble to some extent the Clark seedling but are inclined to be larger, and they may be of the New Oregon variety. At any rate, they are a superior berry, and coming from the seed, are worth studying. "The DeGuire" might possibly take rank among the profitable producers of these parts, being a native and to the manor born.

Are Received in This City. The Salem Commercial club has sent out the following instructions concerning securing gas and oil for the Willamette Valley Shrine drive next Wednesday.

"It is very important that all necessary supplies be taken before coming to the West Side; have therefore arranged with Standard Oil company to supply all your cars with 75 per cent tank capacity at their stations No. 184, Milwaukee and Bybee streets. This station is directly on your line of advance, located far enough out so as to be practically free from commercial applicants and I strongly recommend that the majority of your cars be supplied at this station.

"At East Tenth and Hawthorne is Standard Oil company 'Red, White and Blue' station No. 41 where a good percentage of cars may apply and will receive same services, but Hawthorne avenue is one of our principal thoroughfares and we must be careful not to congest traffic at this point by directing too many cars there.

"There are other filling stations along your route, of the Standard and other companies; no objection, of course, to cars applying for service at any of them, but the two stations of the Standard, above referred to, will have extra force of trained men on hand to give expedited service."
