Marion Republicans Meet and Re-organize for Part in Campaign

STIRRING TALKS HEARD

Tooze and Pogue Are State and Congressional District Committeemen

A harmonious and enthusiastic meeting of the Republican County central committee was held at the court house yesterday afternoon and officers were chosen to direct the work of the campaign.

Walter L. Tooze, chairman of the committee for the past two years,

called the meeting to order and in a very eloquent talk told the assembled committeemen about the Chicago convention and the candidates there nominated for president and vice president. He expressed complete confidence in the success of the ticket and of Republican principles in the coming election.

While waiting for a few of the expected ones to arrive, the chairman called upon Frank Dawey, candidate for the legislature, and David Drager, county treasurer, who gave brief talks on the law governing the organization of the committee and on Republican policies in general.

Ralph E. Thompson of the Marion Automobile company, was unanimously chosen as chairman of the new central committee for the ensuing two years; L. S. Rowland of the Rowland Printing company, was elected secretary and Chester C. Geer of Woodburn was chosen treasurer. Walter L. Tooze was elected state committeeman and M. E. Pogue congressional committeeman.

In several of the precincts the men elected either declined to serve or failed to signify what they intended to do in the matter, so Chairman Thompson appointed a committee consisting of T. F. Claggett, Ben F. Simpson, C. C. Geer, M. Olson and J. H. Rowland to bring in a list of names to fill those vacancies and ex-Chairman Tooze suggested that in as many cases as possible women be selected for the places. This committee will report at the next meeting of the central committee.

Big Surprise Float to be Feature of Two Blocks Long Parade
