## TEACHERS NAME NEW OFFICERS

Salt Lake Convention is Remarkable for Professional Spirit.

SALT LAKE CITY, July 9.—With election by the new directors of the National Education association late today of Miss Olive M. Jones as member of the board of trustees, the plans framed by leaders of the association today were accomplished. Miss Jones is president of the New York state principals' association. Concession of her election, it was said earlier this week, was one factor in obtaining the vote of women

members for Fred M. Hunter of Oakland as president. Mr. Hunter was elected president; Miss Cornelia S. Adair of Richmond, Va., treasurer, and 12 vice presidents and 48 state directors were elected at today's business meeting. The directors at their first meeting this afternoon voted a preference for Philadelphia as the next meeting place, 24 to 17 over Des Moines. The executive committee will decide which of the two cities shall entertain the 1921 convention after visiting both places. The directors also elected T. E. Pinnegan, Pennsylvania state superintendent of schools, as member of the executive committee. Today's business meeting was the scene of a bitter and prolonged fight against the plan to re-organize on a "delegate plan," which eventually carried by a heavy vote. Mrs. Josephine Corlies Preston of Olympia, Wash., retiring president, tonight made public a telegram from Governor Cox of Ohio, Democratic presidential nominee, expressing regret that he was unable to accept her invitation to address the convention.

Mr. Hunter in a brief address following his election, declared the re-organization plan just adopted would permit the association to continue "on a representative, not a soviet, form of government." Mrs. Preston, in a statement at the conclusion of the meeting, said she regarded the convention remarkable "for the fine professional spirit" displayed and said it had been a success in every way except numerically. She said the attendance had been larger than she expected and attributed its lack of still greater size to the number of teachers attending summer schools.

### Youth Protests Innocence as He Goes to His Death

SANTA FE, N. M., July 9.—Elbert W. Blainett, convicted of the murder of Clyde D. Armour, went to his death calmly and still protesting his innocence. The gallows trap was sprung at 5:22 a. m. but Blainett's neck was not broken by the fall. He was unconscious but it was 10 minutes before he was pronounced dead.

### LIGHTNING STARTS FIRES.

ROSEBURG, Or., July 9.—Several forest fires in the mountains 50 miles east of Roseburg were discovered yesterday by airplane patrols and forest reserve men were fighting them today. All of the fires were believed to have been set by lightning. None had obtained great headway and it was said progress toward extinguishing them was being made.

### 13-YEAR-OLD BOY DROWNS.

ASTORIA, Or., July 9.—The body of John Thomas, Jr., 13-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John Thomas of Sunnymead, near Warrenton, was found this afternoon in a slough not far from the family home. The lad went fishing yesterday afternoon and fell overboard as the result of the breaking of a plank on which he was sitting.
