ALLIES MAY OUST TURKS FROM EUROPE FOR GOOD

200,000 Armenians from their homes. "Not only has the Turkish government failed to protect the subjects of other races from pillage, outrage and murder but there is abundant evidence that it has been responsible for directing and organizing savagery against people to whom it owed protection."

For these reasons the allied powers have resolved to emancipate all areas inhabited by a non-Turkish majority from Turkish rule."

Referring to the provisions of the treaty concerning Smyrna, the allied

note points out that they will not have the effect of restricting the trade of Anatolia. On the contrary, it declares, the freedom of the port is guaranteed. It contends that the treaty leaves Turkey a national state with a large productive area and that there is nothing in the treaty "to prevent Turkey from becoming a prosperous nation if she reforms." FINE TROPHY IS AT STAKE IN TOURNEY

Ladd & Bush Bank Presents Bowl as Prize in Tennis Competition.

TOMORROW OPENING DAY

Bleachers Erected for Spectators at Courts on Asylum Avenue.

The Ladd & Bush bank has presented a beautiful and appropriate bowl to the Salem Tennis club to be awarded to the winner of the men's singles championship in the Willamette valley tournament. The trophy will become the permanent property of the individual successfully defeating it through three consecutive authorized tournaments for the Willamette valley championship. It is not required that the tournaments come on consecutive years.

Each winner of the Ladd & Bush trophy in a men's singles championship contest will be permitted to engrave his name on the bowl attesting to his victory. The player winning the trophy will retain possession of the bowl until the next tournament and if defended successfully through subsequent tournaments he will retain the prize permanently. The Ladd & Bush award will be at stake in the tournament which commences tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.

Business Men Help Business men of Salem have come forward with trophies for the other events in the tournament. Paul Wallace offers a cup for the winner of the men's singles. Hartman Brothers jewelry store will award a cup to the winner of the women's singles championship. Winner of the men's doubles championship will receive a trophy given by A. B. Gardner and the Valley Motor company. The Thomas E. Wilson company trophy will go to the winner of the men's singles in the consolation round. No fee is to be charged competitors for this prize. The mixed doubles will receive an award offered by D. J. Fry, Jr., and by Anderson & Brown. George Rodgers and the Salem Tennis club will give a trophy to the winner of the women's doubles. With the exception of the Ladd & Bush trophy, the awards will become the permanent property of the winners in this tournament.

The state tournament held in Portland has closed and a large entry list from the Rose City is assured the local management. As some of the entries from Portland are of high calibre, Salem tennis enthusiasts are assured spirited contests on the Salem tennis courts on Asylum Avenue. No tournament has ever been staged in Salem whose participants were among the best on the coast. It is rumored that California's aspirants to the championship will be in Salem.

Stands Are Erected K. B. Palmer says that stands are being erected at the asylum courts to enable spectators an unobstructed view of the contests. No admissions are charged for the tournament. 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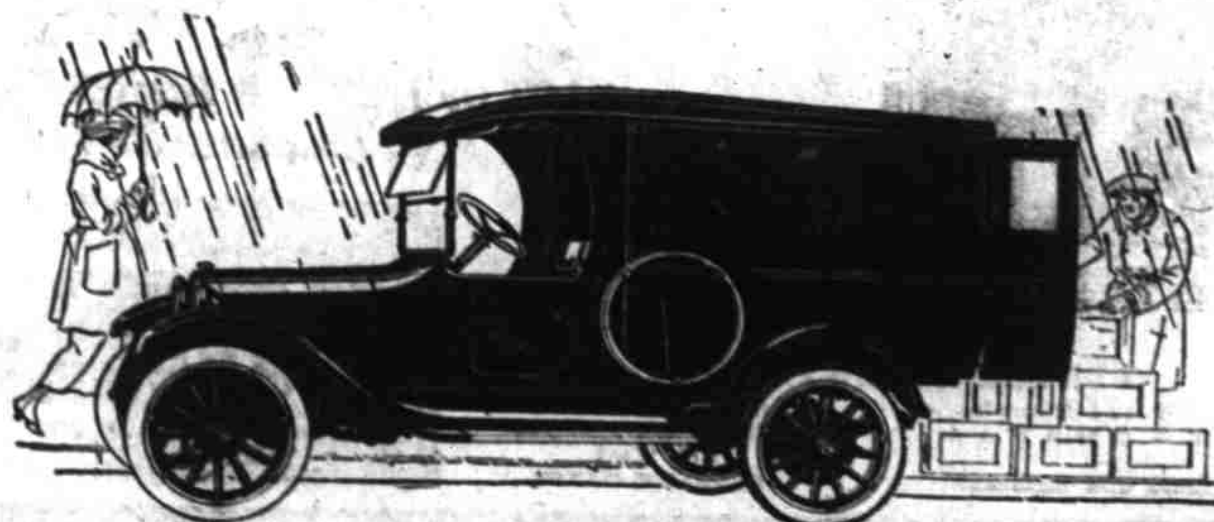
