

MRS. DURDALL FILES REPLY

Fraudulent Representations Are Charged Against Her Husband

Hallie Parrish Durdall, in a reply filed in the suit against her husband, O. B. Durdall, for divorce, claims that fraudulent representations were made to her when she consented to execute a contract which Mr. Durdall presented in his amended answer. Prior to their marriage, Mrs. Durdall claims in her separate reply, Mr. Durdall represented to her that his wealth aggregated only \$15,000, when as a matter of fact, she asserts,

he possessed wealth aggregating between \$45,000 and \$50,000. Mr. Durdall, claims the plaintiff, cautiously guarded from her the disclosure of the dimension of his fortune. What she knows of his wealth, Mrs. Durdall asserts in her reply, she gained after they were married. Mrs. Durdall denies the allegation of Mr. Durdall that she is guilty of repudiation of the contract entered into prior to their marriage. She claims the defendant has failed to meet certain demands of the contract and has neglected other obligations incumbent upon him as a husband. Among other things, she says, the contract stipulated that the husband was to provide for the upkeep of the house and towards the subsistence of his wife.

Mrs. Durdall claims that sometime before their separation this spring, the defendant intimated to Mrs. Durdall his inability to provide for their living. He, she claims, subsequently

requested her to contribute \$50 to the household expenses. Mrs. Durdall states in her reply that her refusal to contribute was one of the causes which led to their separation. Mrs. Durdall branded the expenditures of money and of the improvements on her property engineered by the defendant as an artful design to secure a lien or an interest in her property by him. Failing in this, she avers, he abandoned efforts to secure control of her property. Alleging the contract which the defendant has introduced in his answer was effected through misrepresentation and deception, Mrs. Durdall petitions the court to dismiss the action of the defendant and award her a decree for the dissolution of the marriage.

COUNTIES GET SCHOOL MONEY

Annual Apportionment Is Made by Mr. Hoff from Irreducible Fund

The sum of \$432,267.88 in interest on the irreducible school fund was yesterday apportioned by State Treasurer Hoff among the several counties of the state. The fund and the interest collections are increasing each year, and the per capita apportionment made yesterday is \$2.02. Last year it was \$1.95 and the year before \$1.88. Marion county with 13,161 persons of school age, draws \$26,585.22.

The total amount in the irreducible school fund is \$6,656,979.48 in loans, certificates of sale and cash on hand. This was the figure on June 30. Other statistics gleaned from the treasurer's statement show the total number of persons of school age in the state, between the ages of 4 and 20 years, to be 213,994, an increase of 4381 over 1919 when the number was 209,613. The total apportionment of \$432,267.88 is \$23,522.45 greater than last year when the apportionment was \$408,745.35.

Portland Chauffeur Is Deprived of His License

Alleged violation of the prohibition act and resisting an officer of the law led to suspension of the license of Albert Kunz, Portland chauffeur, by Secretary of State Kizer yesterday. The action was taken at the request of Chief of Police Jenkins of Portland.

This is the first suspension of a chauffeur's license this year under the motor vehicle law. On July 14 Kunz pleaded guilty to violation of the prohibition law and was fined \$100. Jenkins preferred the additional charge of resisting an officer.

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Kunz has 30 days in which to apply for a hearing before the secretary of state. Unless he can show conclusively that the suspension is unjust, the license will remain annulled for a year.
