PROHIS FIGHT FOR STANDING

**Mrs. Unruh Announces Pe-
titions Will Circulate in
Multnomah County**

After conferring with attorneys
at the office of Attorney General
Brown and with the secretary of
state's office Saturday, Mrs.
Ada Wallace Unruh of Portland,
executive secretary of the Prohi-
bition party in Oregon, decided
to circulate petitions in the third
congressional district with the
subject of re-establishing the prohi-
bitionists' status as a political
party in that district.

In excess of 2400 names will
be required on the petitions, or
at least 5 per cent of the total
vote cast for congressman in the
election of 1918. The purpose of
the move is to nominate Dr.

Ether Poble Lovejoy as a candi-
date for congress in the third
district, which cannot be done un-
less legal party standing is ob-
tained.

"Fighting Togs On,"
Mrs. Unruh came to Salem
with fighting togs on," as she

expressed it, hopeful that she
could find authority showing that
a representative in congress is not
a district official, but a state
official, and that it is not neces-
sary for him to be a resident of
the district which he represents.
On this basis Mrs. Unruh believed

the Prohibition party might be
found to have legal status in the
third district. Mrs. Unruh says
she doubts if Representative C.
N. McArthur has a legal residence
in Portland.

The Prohibition leader still be-
lieves the party status might be

re-established in Multnomah
county on this basis, but because
of the absence of Attorney Gen-
eral Brown she decided to use
the petition method.
