More Important Posts Will be Held at State Fair Than Heretofore

Women will take a more active and conspicuous part in the forthcoming state fair than in any held hitherto, many names of prominence having already been announced. The state will be well represented in this respect, matrons and maids from various cities throughout Oregon to serve in a social as well as in a business and professional way. Occupying a place of foremost importance in

the first-mentioned capacity will be the women who preside as patronesses for the different nights of the horse show. Similar honors will be conferred upon the women who will be in charge of Woman's day, which has not yet been definitely set aside, but which will probably be given a place during the mid-week.
