

**Anti-Vaccination Bill
Opposed by Physicians**

Opponents of the anti-compulsory vaccination bill, on which the people are to vote November 2, declare that "anti-vaccination" is only a catch phrase and has little to do with the measure. The bill's real object, they assert, is to kill the entire state health

code, and if the measure is passed they declare it will have the effect of repealing every health law on the statute books. Enactment of the measure, it is asserted, would destroy the operation and the work of the Oregon Social Hygiene society, and it would eliminate the state board of health, all county boards of health, all health officers and all public health nurses. Keep well than to get well, and all the means now used to prevent sickness will be wiped out by the passage of this bill," says a member of the state board of health. "If this bill becomes a law there will be such an increase in sickness that all the doctors will become rich. You will find,

however, that every doctor is against the bill for the same reasons that cause them to accept public service on health boards or as health officers for a mere pittance or nothing. They protect the public against smallpox or diphtheria, rather than hurt them. They will be very much disgusted, however, because one of their pet nobbles, that of preventing sickness and suffering will be held entirely in abeyance. I think the people of this state are too enlightened to pass such an amendment."

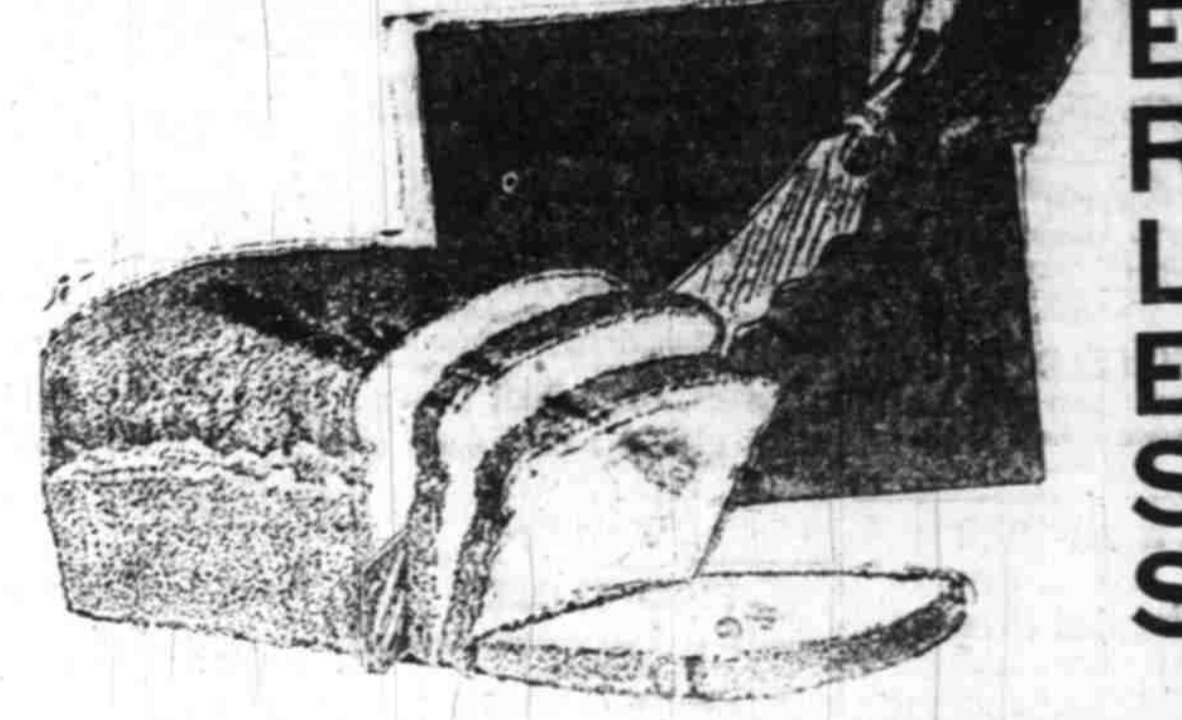
