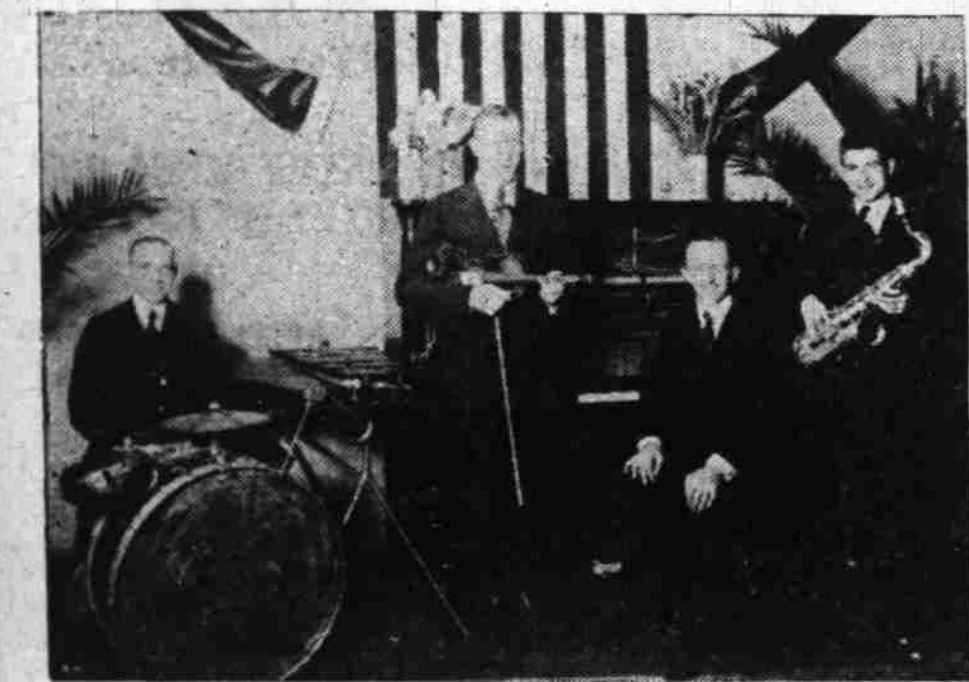

ENGINEERS TOUR WEST

MISSOULA, Mont., Oct. 4.—Sixteen engineers in the employ of the government of India are

on a tour of northwestern lumber camps and mills to study forestry methods in this section. They are traveling under the direction of C. Gilbert Rodgers, director of forestry for the Indian government.

After spending a month in Montana, the party will visit Oregon, Washington and British Columbia, later going to California and then to the eypress swamps of Louisiana and other southern states.

The engineers are not technical forestry men, but have been selected as a nucleus for a forest engineering branch of the Indian government. All were in the British forces during the world war.
