

Labor's capital is only impaired through illness or idleness. and even this loss is largely preventable.

Especially preventable is the idleness that comes to the American laborer by emplaying the cheap labor of other countries to do our work. Just at present we are paying at the rate of 2 billion to 3 billion a year in wages to foreign workers for goods such as should be made in this country.

Three billion dollars is 6 per cent. of 50 billion dollars. Consequently, 50 billion dollars of labor's capital is useless and in the alley back of the fire hall profitless.


