

CALIFORNIA TO RESTRICT JAPS

Adoption of Referendum Has No Effect on Negotiations With Japan

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—Adoption by the California electorate yesterday of the referendum measure restricting the right of aliens to lease or hold real property in that state will not affect, it was learned today, the continuance of negotiations here between the Japanese ambassador and the state department as to the status of Japanese in California and the general subject of Japanese immigration.
