Chairman B. W. McDaniel of the roll call committee of the Red Cross issued the following statement from Willamette chapter yesterday:

"Although the rumble of the World war has scarcely died away the Red Cross is meeting with apathy, and in some cases virtual opposition, in two localities near the city of Salem. the governmental system of the United States. As a result, opposition to the Red Cross is tantamount to opposition to the government system of the United states.

National Barriers Unknown "The American Red Cross knows no national barrier. It is giving aid to every civilized nation irregardless of its part in the

recent war. "If these communities fail to organize and co-operate within the next few days, it is the plan of the local headquarters to send workers directly to the districts to carry on the roll call.
