Two incidents were reported to he police station yesterday of sons who had left horses unblanketed tied out in the cold. This is an offense which is punishable by a fine, and Chief of Police Weish has given instructions to his subordinates that these cases of neglect are to be investigated, and those guilty of he offense made to understand that animals are to be properly protected when left standing out

in inclement weather. Thursday night a horse was reported to the police as having been stolen or removed from where it had been left standing. and the owner urged action on the part of the officers in finding the missing animal. As a matter of fact the horse which had been left out in the storm unblanketed had been put into a stable by a police officer where it would receive proper care. In such cases where this step is taken by the police the owner of the horse or horses are under obligation to pay the livery stable

The other incident reported was of a little different nature but considered an equal offense, in which a horse was staked out for two or three days during the care or protection. The owner was notified that the horse must be given care and protection at
