WILLIAMS IS NEW CHAIRMAN
 Public Service Commission Reorganizes—Ellis is Again Secretary

The public service commission reorganized yesterday as required by law, electing Fred A. Williams, commissioner for the state at large, as chairman to succeed Fred G. Buchtel, whose term had expired. W. P. Ellis was re-elected secretary and the remainder of the personnel of the commission's staff remains unchanged.

Mr. Williams complimented Mr. Buchtel very highly on his official leadership as chairman during the past two years under adverse conditions, and on his handling of the commission's affairs during that period.

In outlining the course for the future Chairman Williams said: "The commission under the stewardship of Chairman Buchtel initiated a constructive program to meet the exigencies of a trying period. The interdependence of industries of every class with the people in general of the state is of such vital importance that the disturbance of this relation in any marked degree will be highly reactionary. The situation at this time is rather critical from the point of view of new manufacture and production.

"The work of the commission is daily increasing in volume and importance. In the past we have been somewhat handicapped by lack of sufficient help and I trust in the future to have available such a staff as will expedite the work at a minimum expense.

Terminal Case Pending
 "It will be my purpose to continue the policy of advancing and safeguarding every interest of the state at large. The Columbia rate case is now history and we are in the midst of preparation for the Northern Pacific terminal hearing at Portland, besides many other important cases pending.

"It is my hope to be able to point at the conclusion of my term to a record of a just, equitable, and impartial administration."

BURNETT NOW CHIEF JUSTICE
Two Departments of State Supreme Court Reorganized Yesterday
 With the accession of Judge George H. Burnett to the seat of chief justice of the supreme court to succeed Chief Justice McBride, according to the regular rotation system based on seniority, the personnel of the two departments of the court has been reorganized.

Department No. 1 is composed of Justices Benson, McBride and Harris, with Benson presiding, and department No. 2 is composed of Justices Johns, Bean and Brown, with Johns presiding. This chief justice is a member of both departments.

The court today admitted to the practice of law in Oregon on nine months' probation, Wesley O. Staver of Pike River. He is admitted on a certificate from Colorado.

The court handed down the following opinions:
 Clifford D. Pugsley vs Fred W. Smyth, appellant; appeal from Harney county; suit for damages because of alleged alienation of wife's affections. Opinion by Justice Harris. Judge Dalton Biggs reversed and case remanded.
 Lexington Investment company et al, vs John L. Watson, appellant; appeal from Douglas county; controversy over title to land. Opinion by Justice Johns. Judge G. F. Skiphorn affirmed.
 Fred Myers appellant vs Clackamas county et al; appeal from Clackamas county; injunction suit to prevent construction of road across land of plaintiff. Opinion by Justice Johns. Judge J. U. Campbell reversed.
 Smith Security company et al, vs Multnomah county, appellant; appeal from Multnomah county; petition for rehearing denied by Justice Johns, appellant.
 Givoux Brothers et al vs Charles Givoux, appellant; appeal from Baker county; suit to compel specific performance of written agreement. Opinion by Justice McBride. Judge Gustave Anderson affirmed.
 F. Wintermute, appellant; vs Oregon-Washington Railroad and Navigation company; appeal from Baker county; action for damages for personal injuries. Opinion by Chief Justice Burnett. Judge Gustave Anderson affirmed.
 Rehearing ordered in Marshall vs Middleton.
 Rehearing denied in Pope vs McDonald.

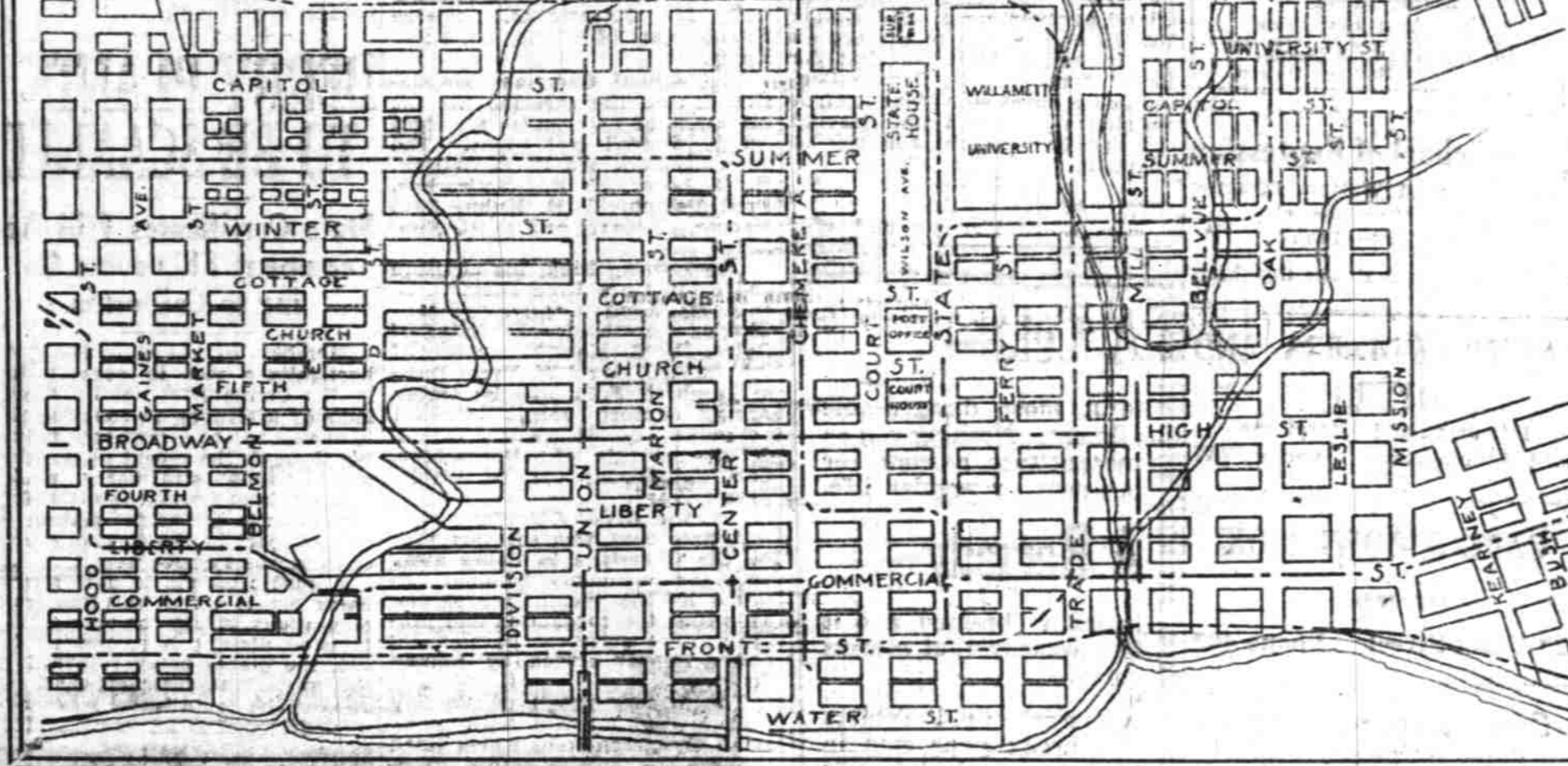
Irrigation Districts Condition Is Indicated
 Oregon's total irrigable area, according to the biennial report of Percy A. Cupper, state engineer, is 1,299,637 acres and the area of land actually under irrigation is 289,026. Bonds that have been voted by the irrigation districts total \$15,832,000, the bonds certified by the irrigation securities commission aggregate \$5,402,500, and those on which the state has guaranteed interest \$3,842,500. Bonds issued since 1916 total \$5,577,500. The amount that has been expended in construction in the districts is \$4,232,500.

In addition to the districts in the tabulation there are now in process of formation six other districts aggregating 18,000 acres. They are: Goss Lake, Harper, Grande Ronde, Glacier, Grogan and Westfall districts.

Guarding Against Debt May be District Policy
 A proposed amendment to the irrigation district law whereby an annual assessment may be levied for the purpose of paying off the outstanding debts of the districts, so the indebtedness may not accumulate, will be discussed at a meeting of the Oregon Drainage Association in Portland Thursday of this week. Percy A. Cupper, state engineer, will attend the meeting and is on the program.

Another proposed change in the law is in the method of foreclosure.

Among national legislative measures the Smith-Fletcher bill, now pending in congress, will be taken up. This measure provides funds both for irrigation and for drainage.
