

In carrying out the raintow idea, Mrs. Buell has bent wires in the form of a rainbow-one end of each wire being fastened to the advertiser's phone number the other to the location of his place of business on the chart of Salem's business section. The judges are impelled to compliment Mrs. Buell. Her solution is clever, original and reasonably accurated
