



Mandamus Issued by Supreme Court in Portland Auditorium Case

The supreme court yesterday issued an alternate writ of mandamus in the friendly action of the state ex rel J. C. Bayer, trustee, plaintiff, against George R. Funk, auditor of the city of Portland, the mandamus requiring Funk to appear May 28 and show cause why he should not draw a warrant on the city treasurer for payment of \$36,702.84 to Bayer, as trustee of the Portland auditorium to pay for completion of

the building. The contract originally was let to Hans Pederson, but the contract was abandoned before completion of the building. building was finally completed, and a committee was named by the city council to fix a payment The committee's report named a figure far in excess of the contract price. There was controversy and a compromise was reached at \$36,702.84. The city auditor has refused to draw the warrant and the action is brought to compel him to do so. The case was taken to court to legalize the payment

Compete for Tempting

Awards at Fair

Highest Honors Will be Free Summer Course at Agricultural College

J. A. Churchill, state superinendent of schools, has made public the premium list showing preminms that will be awarded in inaustrial contests for Oregon boys and girls at the state fair in Sen tember. The contest, are mafe. tained with the co-operation of Oregon Agricultural college, the federal department of agriculture and the state department of edu-

cation. Cash prizes are furnished by the state fair board, \$2000 being appropriated for the purpose. The first prizes in the club winners' contests, trips to Oregon Agricultural college for a two weeks course in the summer of 1922, and provided for by business men and women of Portland and by the state livestock associations.

Board Appropriates Expens As usual the state fair board has appropriated sufficient money to cover the expenses of a be and girls' club camp for at least three days at the state fair. The camp is to be composed of the two boys and the two girls from each county who have scored the greatest number of points tu and one club project in their county, Each county shall provide for bring us many clever solutions. the transportation of these boys and girls to and from the fair at Salem. The state fair board will provide dormitory and meals, but it will be necessary for each boy

and girl to bring bedding. Supervisors Named. Responsible persons will be appointed to act as supervisors of the camp, and the boys and girls will be under their immediate charge from the time they arrive at the fair grounds until they board the trains for their homes. Each boy and girl, before becoming a member of the fair club camp, must agree to submit to the discipline, rules and regulations prepared by the state fair board for the management of the club camp. Each boy and girl must present credentials signed by the county school superinten-

dent of his or her county and by county club leader. Twenty Contests Scheduled Rules governing exhibits are printed in the premium list. There,

will be 20 contests, as follows: Corn growing, potato growing vegetable gardening, poultry raising, pork proddction sheep raising, calf raising, dairy herd record keeping, canning, home making, sewing, cookery, rabbit raising, rural home beautification, milk goats, canning contest, live stock judging contest, county club exhibits, special poultry prize, most artistic booth.
