PROPER RATE CUTS NEEDED BY GROWERS

The first of the fresh fruit will almost necessarily go by express, within the next few days or weeks, the great bulk of the fruit that would be affected by a general reduction is in the apples, that will not be ready for shipment for a long time. By then, the apple schedule may be reduced so that Oregon apples can get to the eastern markets at a profit to grower, buyer and transportation company—a profit that not one of them can hope to get at a ruinous freight rate that prohibits shipment.

Board Is Named By Mr. OLCOTT
Negotiations between the state and the federal government pertaining to the exchange of privately owned lands within or contiguous to the Oregon-California coast lands for lands included in the grant have begun, the land board having today ordered State Forester F. A. Elliott to make cruises under house concurrent resolution No. 8 of the 1921 legislature, of all lands under pending applications. The state will endeavor to transact all of the business by correspondence and save a trip to Washington by G. G. Brown, clerk of the state board.

The concurrent resolution of the Oregon legislature authorizes the state land board to co-operate with the federal government in the cruising and classifying of the lands and in investigating the sale, exchange or other disposition of the lands or the timber on them, and directs the state forester to assist the board.
