CIVILIANS TO GET TRAINING

War Department Announces Encampments at Presidio and at Lewis

PLATTSBURG IDEA USED

Men Between Ages of 16 and 35 are Offered an Unusual Opportunity

SAN FRANCISCO, June 1.—Camps for the military training of civilians, a development of the Plattsburg idea, are to be conducted this summer at the Presidio of San Francisco and Camp Lewis, Tacoma, for men of California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, Utah and Nevada.

The camps will be conducted by the war department and men of average intelligence and who are physically sound and between the ages of 16 and 35 years, are eligible to attend. The department will provide transportation to and from the camps, board and lodging, medical attention, uniform, equipment, arms, ammunition, laundry, athletics and recreation.

Opportunity Is Unusual.

"Never before has an opportunity such as this been offered the young men of this country," said a statement here announcing the camps. "To spend a month in the open air, to stand with shoulders back and chest out, to make a vacation profitable as well as pleasurable, to meet other Americans on common ground, to enjoy the comradeship of patriotic companions, to fire a rifle, to acquire a keen appetite for wholesome army food to wear the uniform as a soldier should, to fit oneself for service, and to the nation in time of stress."

The camps will give instruction in the "red," "white" and "blue" courses, which are progressive and designed to prepare a person with no military training for a commission in the organized reserves. Those completing the "red" and "white" courses will be eligible for appointment as non-commissioned officers and those completing the "blue" course will be qualified for appointment as commissioned officers in the organized reserves.

Attendance at the camps, it was announced, will not obligate the men for military service in any way. Every effort will be made to safeguard the standard of the citizens' military training camps by encouraging attendance of moral and upright men. A certificate of character by school-teacher, clergyman, priest, rabbi or civil officer is required by each applicant. Chaplains of protestant or Catholic faith will be at each camp.

Thousands Will Train.

Announcement was made that men interested should write the commanding general of the ninth corps area, Santa Fe building, San Francisco.

The Presidio and Camp Lewis camps are the two camps to be maintained in the ninth corps area, formerly the western department. In all the camps throughout the nation there will be facilities for training 10,000 men.
