CHEESE WEEK IS SET JUNE 19-26

Dates Are Officially Designated in Letter by Olcott To People

Governor Olcott has designated the week of June 19 to 26, as cheese consumption week. In a letter addressed to the people of the state, he says:

"The dairy industry has a relationship to the public welfare of the people of this state that must be recognized. Cheese constitutes one of the leading products of this great industry, and in its production, our Oregon climate, soil and crops lend ideal conditions to the production of milk and the manufacture of this most wholesome food.

"We produce annually 10,000,000 pounds of cheese of excellent quality. It is produced throughout the entire country, yet our per capita consumption is only one-tenth of what it should be.

"I hereby designate the week from June 19 to June 26 inclusive as cheese consumption week throughout this state.

"I request the full cooperation of the people of this state, in a movement that will encourage one of our best industries and lead to a more extended use of one of our best foods.

"I urge that every home in Oregon take advantage of the opportunity which is presented by this food. I ask for the cooperation of grocers and retail merchants, that this product might be sold on a fair margin of profit, and that hotels and restaurants and all public eating places serve liberal portions at a price that will stimulate consumption.

"I also bespeak the cooperation of the press which is always freely given in the furtherance of every proper and beneficial movement."

Dr. Owens-Adair Writes Frankly About Expenses

The request of the secretary of state's office sent Dr. Owens-Adair for a statement of campaign expenditures in behalf of the hygienic marriage bill, brings from the doctor a very frank letter. She says:

"I must say that I cannot find anything to report. I have not bought any voters, neither has anyone donated one dollar or less amount. I have paid out a few dollars for typewriting, but most has been done for the good of the cause. I have paid my hotel bills and traveling expenses and all my living expenses. My postage was considerable, but I never bought over \$2 worth of stamps at any one time."

Mineral Rights Must Be Assessed, Opinion

Attorney General Van Winkle has written an opinion in reply to an inquiry by the state tax commission holding that mineral rights which have not been assessed for the past five years can be assessed by the sheriff, and should be assessed as real property. Such mineral rights can be assessed separately from the land in case such mineral rights are owned apart from the ownership of the surface of such real estate.

Shell Oil Company Files Regular Monthly Report

According to a statement filed yesterday with the secretary of state, the Shell Oil company of California sold in Oregon during the month of May, 233,623.5 gallons of gasoline and 2534 gallons of distillate. Under the provisions of the fuel tax act of 1919, a tax of \$2348.91 was paid, and under the act of 1921 there was paid in taxes \$2361.58.
