PACT SIGNED FOR HOSPITAL

Agreement Entered Into Between Association and Van Patton Firm

MORE HELP IS NEEDED

Actual Construction Work Is Expected to Start Today is Announcement

An agreement was signed yesterday between the Salem Hospital Association and the local building firm of Van Patton & Son for construction of the proposed new Salem hospital and indications are that the actual work of building will begin at once. The start may be made today, but at the latest it will be some time this week.

Present plans call for construction of a first or central unit, which will include the administrative and industrial departments. This unit will cost about \$2,500, which represents three-fourths of the cost of the completed structure when additional units are built in the future, which contemplates two additional wings.

The central unit will be equipped with wiring, plumbing and heating installation sufficient to take care of the complete structure. The work of the association in enlisting funds for the enterprise is not completed, according to Henry W. Meyers, who has headed this work, and about \$17,000 more is needed to complete the initial unit. Mr. Meyers declares it is necessary for the whole community to get behind the enterprise, as the amount now on hand represents subscriptions from only about 200 persons out of a city population of about 18,000 people.

Seventy-five Beds Possible For heating, plumbing and electrical wiring the association will let contracts.

Forty tons of steel that will be used in the construction have been ordered by the association. The first unit will have accommodations for about 75 persons. The members of the building committee are William McGillchrist, Jr., T. B. Kay, Russell Catlin, Dr. R. E. L. Steiner and H. W. Meyers.

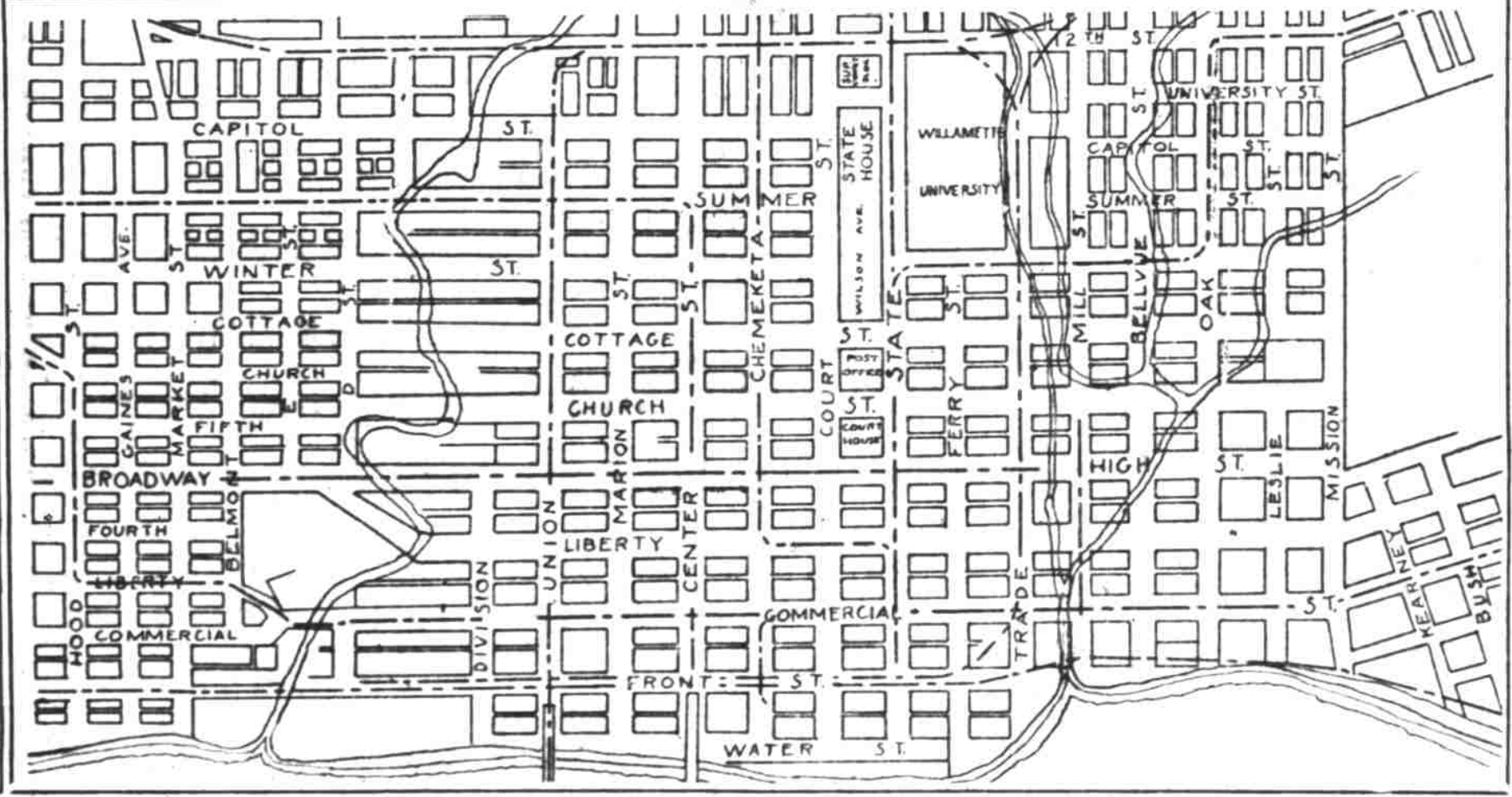
