July 1 is Date—Salmon and Halibut to Be Cheaper Than Last Year

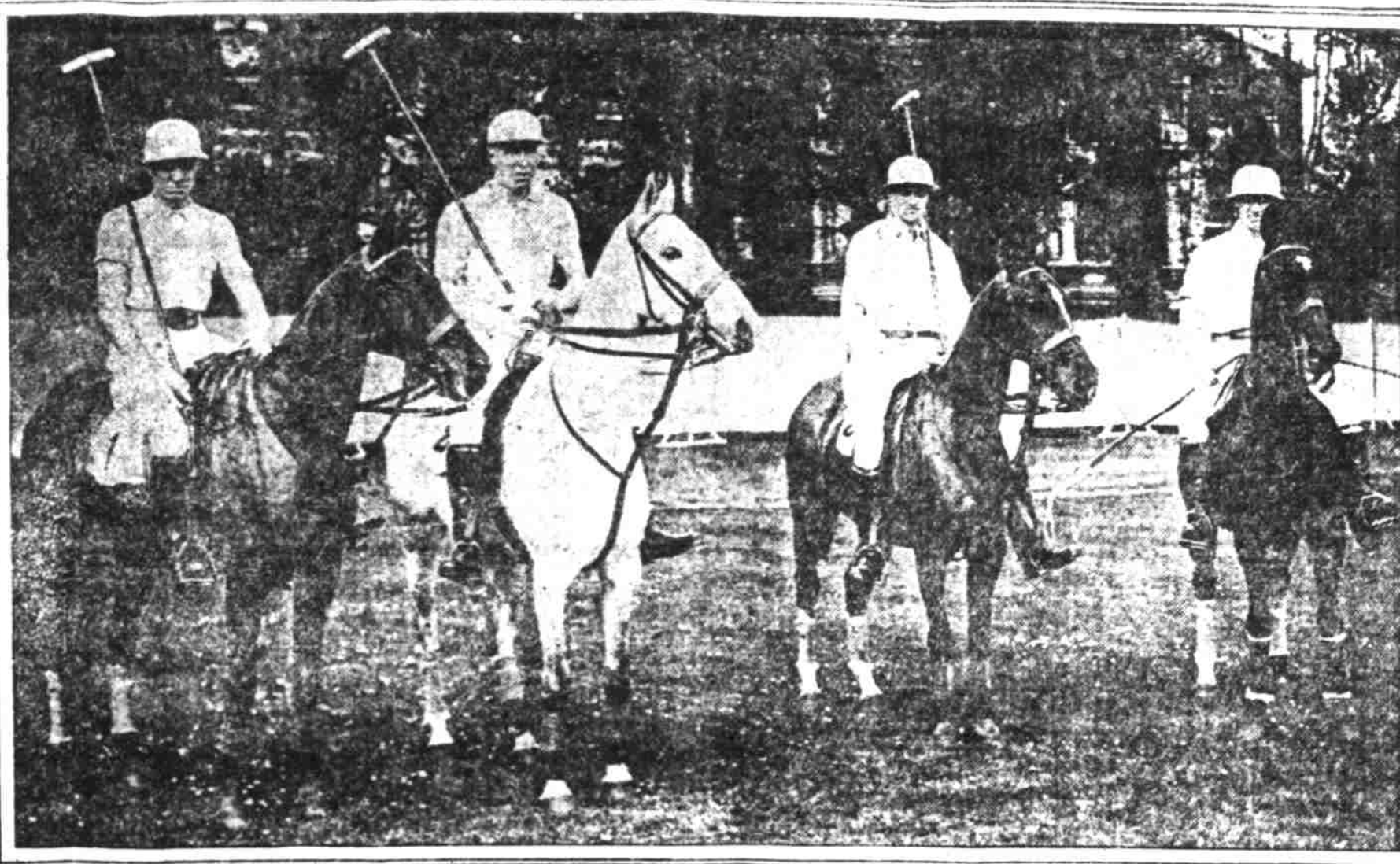
FISH EATING IS URGED

ment, but the police were obliged to withdraw to avoid bloodshed. Peaceful efforts by the secretary for native affairs and others to induce the "Israelites" to withdraw failed. They steadfastly refused to go.

Finally a force of 500 mounted police moved from Queens-town to surround the grounds of the village. With heads of clubs raised, they charged the police with "word" and were met with volleys of shot. The police let them come on until within 10 yards and then fired with the result stated. Thereupon the "Israelites" were ordered and the village is to be demolished.

The village has been some 100 in the Cape house of assembly. Premier Smith declared that in

view of the natives' obstinacy, there was no other way to make them understand that they must obey the law.

NATIVE SECT IS EJECTED

Followers of Enoch Lose in Battle With Police Near Capetown

CAPE TOWN, June 29.—A native religious sect which calls itself the "Israelites," under a "prophet" named Enoch, who refused to evacuate government land at Bulhoek, near Queens-town, Cape Colony, has been forcibly ejected, losing 171 killed and 126 wounded in a fight with mounted Cape police.

For some years past the government had permitted the "Israelites" to celebrate "Passover" on a common, but each year a growing number of pilgrims remained behind on what they called "holy ground" until a village of some 550 huts had sprung up. The sect forbade anybody to enter the village, or to recognize any authority except orders from "Jehova, the God of Israel," as interpreted by Enoch, the prophet.
