Postal Examination is To Be Held in Salem The United States civil service commission announces a post office clerk-carrier examination to be held on August 6, 1921, for the purpose of establishing an eligible register from which selections may be made to fill vacancies as they may occur in the position of clerk or carrier, post office service at Salem, salary, \$1,400 per annum. All citizens of the United States who meet the requirements, both men and women, may enter this examination. Appointing officers, however, have the legal right to specify the sex desired in requesting certification of eligibles. Age limits are 18 to 45 years on the date of the examination. Age limits do not apply to persons entitled to preference on account of military or naval service. For further information and application blank apply to Paul W.
