The report stated that Mr. Wilson tried to pass between the two cars. Mr. Wilson was not badly injured, it is said.

Delinquent Street Assessments Receive Drastic Treatment Hereafter The city council, which has been pretty lenient with those who refused to pay their street assessments, has come to the conclusion that it is about time for a change. Hereafter, when a street assessment has been due and unpaid for six months, the council will favor the issuing of certificates of delinquency. After being issued, this certificate can be sold to any person and will hold good as a lien against the property. According to Ray L. Smith, city attorney, such a certificate of delinquency can be foreclosed just the same as any other certificate of delinquency for unpaid taxes. After such a certificate is issued, it draws interest at the rate of 12 per cent annually. The frame of mind of the city council was brought about by the delay and refusal of many parties who gave no attention to notices that their street assessments were due and unpaid.
