

Liquor Tax Adopted
The Wadsworth amendment providing for a tax of 60 cents a gallon on beer, \$1.20 a gallon on wines, and \$6.40 a gallon on whiskey, manufactured, imported or sold so as to provide for double rates on such liquors unlawfully diverted for beverage purposes.

Senator Reed's amendment proposed to raise a special fund in the treasury department for expenses of the bonus plan by continuing excess profits taxes on corporations at 1921 rates.

Republican leaders characterized the Reed amendment as "political play" and predicted the amendment would be rejected.
