

DALLAS SHIPS BIG PRUNE CAR Solid Consignment of 20-30's, Setting Precedent For Oregon, Goes Out

A solid car of 20-30 prunes has just been shipped from Dallas. This is probably the first full car of prunes of this size that has ever been shipped from Oregon.

Prunes were produced in the Willamette valley this season and Dallas, Albany and Lebanon were especially favored with large sizes.

This season the largest proportion of the prunes are 30-40's, while last year's crop averaged nearly 50 to the pound.

Estill Brunk Returns After Adventure at Sea

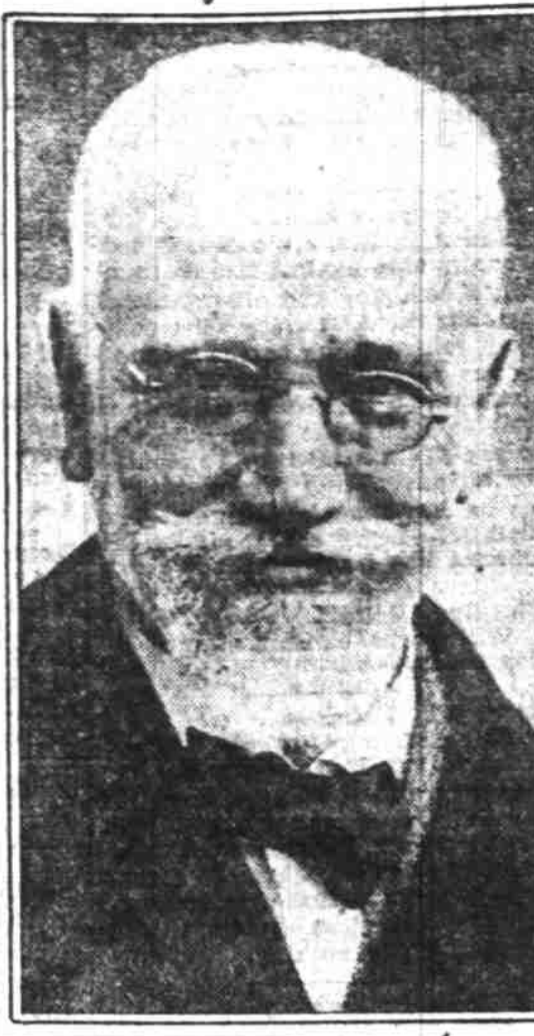
