Champion Coyote Killer
Confers With His Chief
PORTLAND, Nov. 17.—Harold
Dobyns, chief of the United States
biological survey's predatory animal de
partment, was in Portland today
confering with his chief, Stanley
G. Jewett. Dobyns is working
in the Blue mountain region of
eastern Oregon this winter. Since
July 17 he has killed 86 predatory
animals and during the last
13 days he killed 18 coyotes by
poison.
Alfred Andrews, who is work
ing on the south end of the De
chutes national forest in the Port
Rock county, where the coyotes
are much more plentiful, killed 51
coyotes and bob cats during Oc
tober.
