TRAINING SCHOOL FUND READJUSTED

Oregon Social Workers Object to Site—New One Will Be Purchased

House bill No. 10 calls for an appropriation of \$280,000 for the proposed new state training school buildings and a new site on which to build. It is the senate bill enacted last session except that it inserted an objection of social workers to the site selected by the board of control. A new site will be selected. The money is diverted from the one-fourth mill road levy.

House concurrent resolution No. 2, by Davey, shows that while the last legislature appropriated \$280,000 for the building and equipment of such a school on the present state farms near Salem, there is much objection to the site.

The old appropriation cannot be diverted, any part of it, to new grounds. If a new place is chosen a way to buy the site is necessary. The resolution provides for a committee of three representatives and three senators, to confer with the board and if desirable choose a new site.

House bill No. 11, by Fletcher, provides for a better form of absentee ballot for primary elections. The voter who knows that he is to be absent at election time, may secure an official ballot and vote his sentiments, under easier conditions than those now existent.

House bill No. 12, by Gordon, allows lodges organized by charter prior to 1859, to extend their personal and realty holdings without legal limitation. They may change their name, by proper procedure, and by paying a proper recording fee.

A stoppage in the electric power line, Tuesday morning, and a delay in the delivery of copy to the state printer Monday night, left the house stranded without a single printed bill to work on, up until noon, Tuesday. A motion to sick the printing committee on the printer, and the statement of the speaker that the printer hadn't had the bill copy when he did have the power, Monday, resulted in a general scramble to get things adjusted.

SENATE BILLS

The following bills were introduced in the senate yesterday:
 S. B. 9, Nickelson—To amend section 5636, Oregon laws, relating to loans on encumbered property by the state land board.
 S. B. 10, Norblad—Providing for the transportation of public school pupils and lodging for pupils in certain cases.
