POLICE CARS ON THE JOB

Valued by El Paso Police
Officials

There are three "members" of the El Paso, Texas, police force, who are fairly entitled to good conduct badges, according to Police Chief Edwards of that city. The three work 24 hours each day, never receive pay, are never absent on account of sickness, and pace any beat without a murmur.

They are the three Dodge Brothers cars of the police department, whose sudden appearance in the streets brings fear to the lawbreaker in the Texas city.

Police cars are called on for unusual service in that they are actually in service or likely to be called on at any time of day or night. Once every month they are "steamed out" at the city corral, and the police officers say that this is 90 per cent of the attention given the Dodge Brothers cars.

The police reporter of the El Paso Morning Times tells an interesting story of an actual chase in one of the Dodge Brothers cars which illustrates the treatment they are sometimes given.

"I have just been held up by two masked men at so-and-so corner. I'll wait here for you!" comes a nervous voice over the telephone.

"Blue-coated figures rush for the Dodge Brothers cars, and in an instant are on their way to the scene of the robbery. Up dark alleys, through unpaved streets, across litter-covered lots, up steep embankments, and to places one would consider impassible, the Dodge Brothers cars are driven in the search. Two figures are seen to cross the canal bridge. The car

is braked violently to a standstill and reversed until the street intersection is reached. Not knowing the roadbed upon which the car travels, the driver points his car directly after the offenders. Using the car as a bulwark, a gun battle follows. The radiator is filled with bullets, but the bandits are finally captured. In the bullet-ridden car, they are transported to the police headquarters.

"No wonder," adds the police reporter, "that all the police officials are unanimous in their praise of the Dodge Brothers cars."

One Dodge Brothers car has stood up well under this kind of service since 1917, and the other two have served since 1918 and 1919 respectively.

The car was sold together on the reputation of the Paige cars and the company's ability to build real quality cars. With this in mind, Mr. and Mrs. Billingsley are glad to be the first owners of the Jewett in Salem.

Auto Associations Begins Fight Against Oil Tax

Believing that the proposed tariff of 35 cents a barrel on crude oil, 25 cents a barrel on fuel oil, and the proposed \$1 to \$3 tariff on asphalt if successful would materially and adversely affect the individual automobile owners of the country and add to their already heavy upkeep, maintenance and taxation burdens, the American Automobile association has entered a vigorous protest against these proposals.

Speaking in behalf of the owners of more than ten million motor vehicles, the A. A. A. representatives appeared before the United States senate committee on finance and made it plain that the A. A. A. would fight to the last ditch any proposal designed to take any more revenue from the motor car. While the A. A. A. representatives went before the committee prepared to combat only a 25 cents a barrel tax on crude oil, they learned that certain interests were even planning oil tariff to the extent of \$1 a barrel.

A new feature of the income tax law requires that every person who had a gross income of \$5,000 or more, for 1921, must file a return, regardless of whether or not that sum yielded him a cent of profit. To illustrate: A received from his business and other sources \$5,000 during the year 1921, but his deductible expenses for the year aggregated \$4,500.

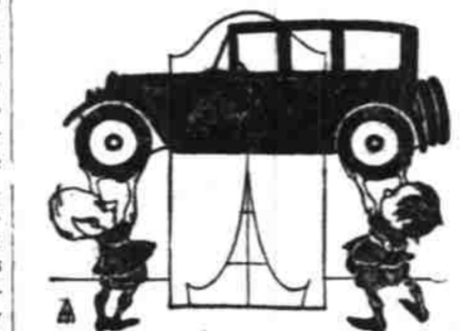
