Sealed proposals will be received by the Oregon State Board of Control up to 11 a. m., February 10, 1922, and then opened, for the installation of a forced blast system of ventilation to be installed in the Capitol Building, Salem, Oregon. Plans and specifications may be had from the office of the Board of Control, Salem, Oregon, or from Jay H. Keller, 613 Worcester Building, Portland, Oregon, upon deposit of \$25 which will be returned to the contractor when the plans and specifications are returned in good condition.

All proposals must be accompanied by a certified check in the amount of 5 per cent of the total amount bid payable to R. B.
