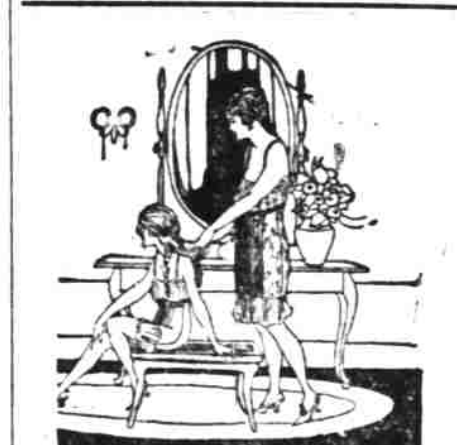

Mr. and Mrs. Fred Lamport are other Salem folks in Jacksonville now having written to friends from there.

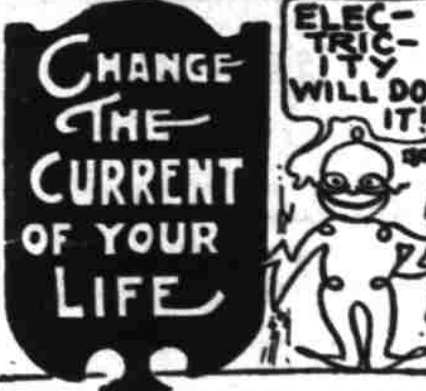
