BASEBALL TEAM WORKS INDOORS

Coach Bohler Starts Squad of Eighteen at Practice on Armory Floor

Coach Bohler had 18 of his prospective baseball stars hard at work Monday afternoon on indoor baseball practice.

"We're going to start in on form, the very first thing," was the coach's announcement. "You're going to take the ball right, and go through it all, step by step, with especial care as to form. Once you learn to do it right, you'll pick up the speed fast enough. But to learn things in the wrong way, never will give a fair chance for improvement."

He had a squad of three batters with three catchers, to handle the balls, and the rest of the team were the fielders on the armory floor.

Towner, catcher from last year, is back and was on hand. He served in the marine corps during the war, and in one of the intervals between shooting hot ones at the Huns, he once caught two innings for the marine corps team against the Washington leaguers, with the great Walter Johnson and the rest of the big ones against him. He is really the only one of the old regular team to report for service, though Robbins, Oliver and one or two others were out for the first meeting, who have played on the scrubs. Ashby, former Salem high general athletic star, is believed to be the class of the new pitchers though only a field trial will determine the standing of any of the players.

OREGON QUINTET HERE THIS WEEK

If Bearcats Can Put Ball Through the Hole They May Win Two Games

If they had a terribly profane old elder, a pious old duck who swore desperately, when he addressed them to "Shoot it!" and the Bearcats had done what he said, they might have won a monumental victory at Eugene last Friday and Saturday nights. But they didn't have him, they didn't go it, and there you are. They lost both games, 20 to 17 and 27 to 12.

The authentic record of the game says that the Bearcats gave their opponents a fearful scare. They razzed 'em all over the floor; they guarded closely, and took the ball almost whenever they wanted it, which was most of the time. But they failed to convert their chances into something solid. They would run the sphere up to within a sixteenth of an inch of the goal, and then the jinx would distract their aim.

At that, the score in the first game indicates that the Bearcats have a splendid chance to win somewhere in the series. While it is recognized that Oregon has probably strengthened its team since the first of the season, and that the Bearcats probably are playing as well but shooting less well than they did in their very first game of the year, Oregon doesn't look good enough to make it much if any better than a draw.

Coach Bohler plans to take up some of the sure comebacks for next year, the reliables who will surely be here to carry on the basketball game, and keep them at fundamental practice for several more weeks this spring. The team will lose three regulars and one substitute by graduation, and they will have to start with a new squad for 1923.

Next year's practice, they hope to begin right now, with the unromantic but vital practice of getting the ball into the basket, as nine of the 10 principal points. If some of these boys have to throw the ball five million times to insure the accuracy in the games for next season, they're going to be kept at it until they connect with the hoop and count two every time.
