MARKET RESUMES ACTIVE OPERATION

Public Participation Contributes to Large Turnover of Shares

NEW YORK, March 20.—Recent active and comprehensive operations in the stock market were resumed today. Public participation apparently contributed appreciably to the turnover of approximately 1,750,000 shares.

Investment as well as junior rail shares registered extreme advances of 1 to 3 points.

Another reaction in foreign exchanges, with acute weakness in the German rate, was offset in part by the continued ease and abundance of local money rates and freer offerings of time funds, particularly for merchants' paper. In the open market transactions at 3 per cent ruled.

The reversal in international currencies carried demand bills on London two cents under last week's final quotation. French, Italian and Belgian bills were 4 to 6 points lower and all other former neutrals, Denmark excepted, eased correspondingly, with a low of 33-3/8 cents a hundred for the German mark, a new low for the year.

WHEAT TRADING IS DEPRESSED

Bears Prevail When Lower Quotations from Liverpool Are Received

CHICAGO, March 20.—Increasing supplies on ocean passage together with lower quotations from Liverpool had a depressing effect today on the wheat market here. Prices closed unsettled at the same as Saturday's finish to 1c lower, with May 1.38 1/2 to 1.38 3/4 and July 1.20 1/2 to 1.21 1/2. Corn and oats both finished unchanged to 1/8 off, with provisions off with a setback of 20c.

Bears in the wheat pit had the advantage from the outset owing to reports showing that world shipments for the week just ended were much larger than during the preceding week and nearly double the total a year ago. Word that Germany had purchased 500,000 bushels of new crop wheat in this country was a further help toward recovery of the prices near the end of the day.

Corn and oats were easier with wheat.

Provisions were higher early as a result of an upturn in hog values, but declined later.
