STEEL MERGER

Boards of Directors Confirm Actions Recently Tentatively Announced

NEW YORK, May 16. - The purchase of the Lackawanna Steel company by the Bethlehem Steel corporation was approved by both boards of directors and representatives of six other large independent steel companies who held the first of several meetings to arrange terms with Kuhn, Loeb ing both deals before they were consummated and the summoning of the principles before the Lockwood legislative committee, in-

vestigating the housing situation. The Bethlehem - Lackawanna deal, which must be ratified by special meetings of stockholders to be held later, involves the issuance of \$35,108,500 in new capital stock by the Bethlehem company, equal to the par value of the backawanna stock outstanding. Forty per cent of the payment will be made in 7 per cent preferred and 6 per cent in class B common. Bethiehem, however, reserves the right to reduce the amount of preferred and increase the amount of class B common paid by \$1.543,000 par value upon payment of approximately
