General Rush to Sell on May Delivery Witnessed on Board of Trade

CHICAGO, May 25.-Wheat trading today consisted of what appeared to be the mopping up of wreckage of the May delivery. Demand for wheat to deliver on May contracts here had seemingly come to a halt, and with chances greatly diminished for a monthend squeeze, something of a general rush to sell was witnessed. The market closed unsettled 1-2 to 4 cents net lower, with May 1.28 to 1.28 1-2 and July 1.21 3-4 to 1.21 7-8. In a series of price breaks which

followed the opening of business in wheat, the market underwent an extreme fall of 4 3-4 cents. but then began to rally, helped by profit taking on the part of the bear speculators. Considerable notice was also taken of the fact that the Liverpool market had failed to follow the decline of valnes he.e. However, the majority of traders went on the assumption that the report of the collapse of May operations on the bull side was an accepted fact. This view was furthered by continuance of liquidating sales which were only offset in part by action of shorts in profit taking. The new liquidation was ascribed chiefly to eastern interests.

A disposition to be conservative on the selling side developed during the late trading in wheat, On, the other hand the outlook was that the bulk of domest'e available supply would be located in Chicago by the end of the month.
