#### TEN JUDGES BALLOTTED ON

Many on Circuit Bench Hold  
Over—Only Two Choose  
To Quit Posts

Ten of the 20 judicial districts in Oregon nominated candidates for circuit judge in the primary election of May 12, and in all cases where incumbents, either Republican or Democratic, were

up for renomination they were successful.  
Few Democratic candidates for judgeships were on the ballots, however, and in many of the districts the Democrats nominated the Republican incumbents by writing in their names on the ballots.

**Double Nominations Received**  
Republican judges who received Democratic nominations were: John S. Coke in the second district, Percy R. Kelly and George G. Bingham in the third district, J. U. Campbell in the fifth district, George R. Bagley in the 19th district and J. A. Eakin in the 20th district.

Also two Democratic incumbents received the Republican nominations. These were: J. W.

Hamilton and George T. Skipworth in the second district.

**Some Judges Retire**  
Present judges who did not come up for renomination and who will retire from the bench are: Frank W. Calkins of Medford, first district; O. F. Stone of Klamath Falls, 15th district.

The fourth district (Multnomah county) is not included in the above for the reason that the Democratic returns were sent back by the secretary of state for correction. For department No. 3 the Democratic ballot named no candidate, but doubtless one was nominated by writing in the name. In the other departments but one candidate was named for each, and it is safe to say they were nominated. These were: Department No. 1, W. T. Vaughn; department No. 5, W. N. Gatens, incumbent; department No. 6, Roscoe P. Hurst; department No. 7, G. F. Alexander.
