**HAMS ARE WAY UP**  
**NEW BIDS SHOW**

**Semi-Annual Opening of Proffers Made by State Board of Control**

Hams have increased in price \$11.70 a hundred in the last six months, according to bids on supplies for the state institutions that were opened yesterday by the state board of control. Bids are opened semi-annually. The bid received on hams yesterday was \$31.70 a hundred, while in December the state had to pay only \$20. All bids are L. O. B. Salem.

Three bids were received yesterday on sugar. The lowest was \$6.45 a hundred. Six months ago the state paid \$5.57 for its sugar supply.

Fresh beef is slightly lower, the new bid being \$7.94, which is 46 cents a hundred less than the bid of \$8.40 in December.

Bacon is up. The new bid is \$21.65 and the old \$18. Hard wheat flour has scarcely changed. The new bid is \$5.43 and the old bid \$5.40. The new price on soft wheat flour is \$4.80 and the old \$4.95.

**STOCK MARKET HAS REACTION**

Price of Many Favorite Issues Fall Sharply on Stock Exchange

NEW YORK, June 15.—The stock market today experienced what is technically known as a "secondary reaction," prices of many favorite issues in various speculative groups falling sharply after a firm to strong opening. A very considerable part of the early buying evidently represented heavy covering, based on cables announcing a cut in the bank of England discount from 4 to 3 1/2 per cent, the lowest rate since January, 1914.

The cut in the British rate was the more surprising from the fact that Washington advices quoted treasury officials as opposed to any lowering of federal reserve rates in spite of numerous requests from branch institutions. As soon as the early demand for stocks had been satisfied, heavy selling orders appeared, especially in shipping and equipment. These soon extended to such leaders as Mexican Petroleum, Studebaker, Baldwin and independent steels.

The list displayed its heaviest tone on news that the railway brotherhoods had taken a more aggressive attitude on the strike vote question.

Final prices disclosed net losses of 2 to 6 points in the steels, prominent equipments, motor and rubber accessories, domestic and foreign oils and petroleum and shippings, while such rallies as Southern Pacific, Reading and N York Central forfeited 1 to 2 points. Sales amounted to 1,385,000 shares.

Call money opened and held at 3 1/2 per cent throughout. Time rates were easier for 30 and 60 day loans, but recent firmness for the longer maturities was maintained.

All the important foreign exchanges were strengthened by the action of the bank of England.

**Timber Production Now 9 Per Cent Over Normal**

One hundred and twenty-two mills reporting to West Coast Lumbermen's association for the week ending June 10, manufactured 88,337,011 feet of lumber; sold 94,180,847 feet; and shipped 86,844,735 feet.

Production for reporting mills was 9 per cent above normal. New business was 7 per cent above production. Shipments were 8 per cent below new business.

Thirty-five per cent of all new business taken during the week was for future water delivery. This amounted to 32,710,847 feet, of which 23,266,415 feet was for domestic cargo delivery, and 9,454,432 feet for over-seas shipment. New business for delivery by rail amounted to 2,049 cars.

Thirty-four per cent of the week's lumber shipments moved by water. This amounted to 23,274,735 feet, of which 21,774,551 feet moved coastwise and inter-coastal; and 7,500,184 feet export. Rail shipments amounted to 1,919 cars.

Unfilled domestic cargo orders total 114,124,534 feet. Unfilled export orders total 7,439,012 feet. Unfilled rail trade orders, 6,955 cars.

In 23 weeks production has been 1,844,411,696 feet; new business 1,887,016,817 feet; shipments, 1,783,153,320 feet.

**SCARE IS GONE, PRICE IS DOWN**

**Wheat Market Not so Good When Crop Damage Remains Unconfirmed**

CHICAGO, June 15.—Lessened apprehension as to crop damage did a good deal to bring about lower prices today for wheat. The close was unsettled at 1 1/4 to 2 1/2 cents net decline, with July \$1.09 1/4 to \$1.09 3/4, and September \$1.11 to \$1.11 1/4. Corn lost 1/4 to 1/2 c, and oats 1/4 to 1/2 c. Provisions finished unchanged to a shade off.

With more seasonable temperatures looked for to abate ill effects of excessive heat in the southwest and with good rains reported in the northwest, holders of wheat began to unload soon after the opening. A lack of new speculative demand was apparent. Absence of overnight export business tended also to weaken the market here.

Just before the close messages from the seaboard said 750,000 bushels to 1,000,000 bushels of wheat had been worked for Europe, but the effect in Chicago was somewhat discounted by assertions that export bids here had dropped to 6 cents over July 1 c. Buffalo as compared with 8 cents over on Monday. There was also a little milling call here in the late trade, but price rallies from the low point of the day were only moderate.

Beneficial rains in Iowa were largely responsible for sending the corn market downward. Oats dropped to the lowest prices in this season, heavy sales more than offsetting a brief show of strength caused by adverse crop reports.

Provisions were governed by the action of hog values.
