

BONUS MEASURE CAUSES FIGHT

Democratic Senators Attack Reported Compromise of Republicans

WASHINGTON, June 17.—The bonus fight broke unexpectedly in the senate today when Democratic senators attacked the reported compromise agreement of Republican leaders not to call up the measure next Monday but to have it follow the tariff bill.

Wash. Follows Conference

The senate today followed conference between President Harding and Republican leaders at which the president was assured that Monday's conference with the Republican senators would result in holding the tariff bill before the senate with a declaration that the bonus bill should be passed before the senate adjourns.

Walsh Makes Charge

The senate debate was enlivened by a charge from Senator Walsh, Democrat, Massachusetts that "an honest majority" of the senate was not behind the bonus bill and that a group of senators professing to favor it were "ducking and dodging." And seeking to avoid going on record.

SHIP SUBSIDY SLATED SOON

Compromise Plan Does Not Meet With Approval of President

WASHINGTON, June 17.—Under a compromise plan suggested today to President Harding by house republican leaders and which, it was said, did not meet his disapproval, the house will take up the ship subsidy bill immediately after the senate has passed the tariff bill.

While the question will be considered further at White House conferences next week, Chairman Campbell of the rules committee who outlined the situation to the president, declared tonight that it was "morally certain no action will be taken on the subsidy bill by the house until the senate has concluded consideration of the tariff."

Duration Uncertain

How long it might be before the senate ended its tariff fight, no member of the house would predict. Leaders declared, however, that if the suggestion laid before the president by Mr. Campbell was definitely accepted the house about July 1, could begin three day recesses to run approximately a month.

A quorum would be needed to send the tariff bill to conference and with this object out of the way these members believed the ship subsidy bill, once before the house could be passed or defeated within a week.

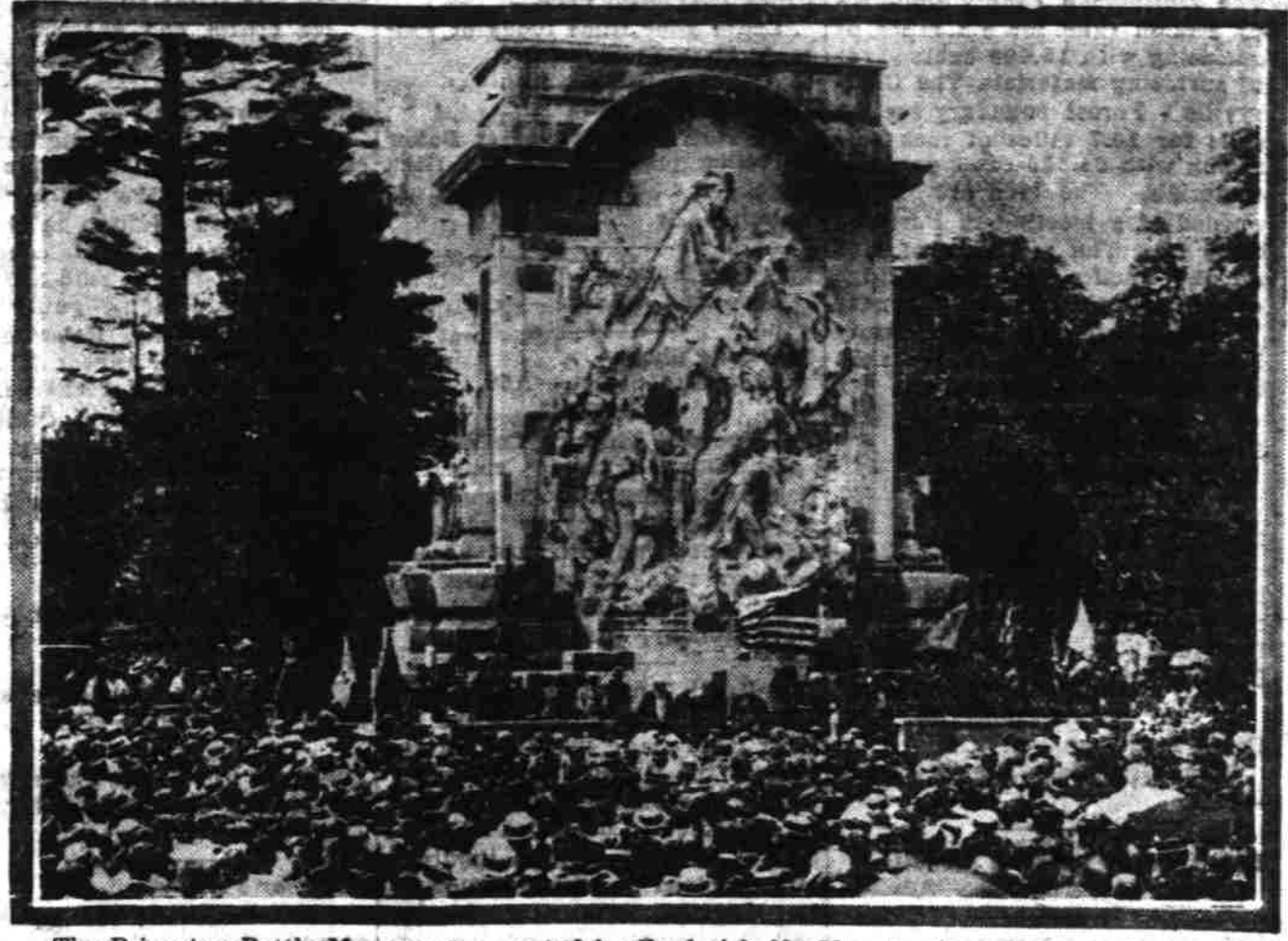
Campbell Hastily Summoned

GRAM ASKED TO WITHDRAW ORDER

Employment Tickets With Strike District Designated Cause Trouble

Declaring that an order issued by C. H. Gram, state labor commissioner, requiring employment agencies to explain on their employment tickets that Klamath Falls is a strike district, is making it difficult for concerns in that community to secure the type of employees sought, a number of individuals and establishments of Klamath Falls and vicinity have petitioned Mr. Gram to withdraw his order.

Mr. Gram's move was made with a view to protecting laborers going to Klamath Falls shortly after the timberworkers' strike was called on February 28. Although the strike, which was called by the timbermen in the hope of maintaining an eight-hour day, is still on, Klamath Falls petitioners declare that it is of a purely technical nature.
