**DRY WEATHER BOOSTS GRAIN**

Reports from Canada and Extreme West Reach Board Tuesday

CHICAGO, June 20.—Dry weather-complaints from Canada and from some sections west of here had considerable to do today with bringing about an advance in the price of wheat. The market closed unsettled, 2 1-8 to 2 5-8 net higher, with July 1.12 5-8 to 1.12 3-4 and September 1.13 1-4 to 1.14 3-8.

Corn gained 3-4 to 1 1-8c and oats 1-4 to 7-8c. In provisions, the outcome was unchanged to a rise of 2-1-2.

Probable deterioration from lack of rain formed the outstanding feature of wheat reports from Canada and led to a good deal of buying near the end of the session in the wheat market.

At the same time, talk was current that parts of Nebraska and other states needed rain and that the expected yield of winter wheat in such relatively dry territory had been diminished to a material extent by recent extreme heat. Earlier in the day, an upturn in wheat quotations at Liverpool and in sterling exchange proved helpful to the bull side of the market here.

An additional reason given for the upward swing of wheat values today was that selling from the country against the new crop had been of unlooked for small proportions as yet.

Corn and oats were mainly influenced by the action of wheat. Good demand for corn for export was said to prevail at the seaboard. Provisions averaged a little higher in line with pigs.

**PETROLEUM IS STAR PERFORMER**

Extra Advance Made Yesterday—Intimations of Corner Are Scouted

NEW YORK, June 20.—Mexican Petroleum again was the star performer in today's active and strong stock market. It made an extra advance of 11 1-2 points, with a net gain of 9 1-2 or a total of 23 3-4 points above last week's final price.

At times traders seemed to regard the extraordinary operations in Mexican Petroleum as something of a menace to the general market. Intimations of a "corner" were scouted, however, the opinion still prevailing that the movement was mainly levelled against extensive short interest.

Other oils in the foreign and domestic groups registered good advances of two to almost five points; and the independent steels were equally strong with a sudden burst of activity at higher levels for United States steel in the final hour.

Next to oils, Studebaker was the leading stock, its net gain of 6 5-8 points to the year's high record being associated with rumors of increased or extra dividends in the near future. Baldwin was foremost among the equipments on its gain of 4 3-8 points.
