"Regardless of any question of the right of the men to strike the men who take the strikers' places are merely accepting the wages and working conditions prescribed by a government tribunal and are performing a public service. They are not accepting the wages and working conditions which an emptoyer is trying to hapose for this reason, public sentiment and full government power will protect the men who remain in their positions and new

men who may come in."
