materials in the tree and, possibly, having a more complicated bearing, such as the effect on the eucalyptus, and secondary, but very important, nutrients.

These conditions grade off into less striking but still serious types of injury that we have often noted. For example, the unprecipitated heat and drouthy

dry season of most of the eastern states last summer has had some serious effects. Hilley peaches dropped their buds by abortion in Georgia to a considerable extent this spring in some localities. Furthermore, they dropped their young fruit after setting in a puzzling way. In my own orchard the Champion peach dropped a lot of its buds by abortion. They never started to swell in the spring, just as the cherry buds sometimes do, but after that these Champion peaches held their fruit that set. In nearby Virginia and Maryland, doubtless as a result of the drouth, apple buds were smaller, that is, had fewer blossoms, often being limited to two or three and sometimes only one blossom instead of five or six, and occasionally seven blossoms, as thrifty apple clusters may have. Furthermore, the blossoms were smaller in size, even the petals being reduced. It was evident, therefore, that many of the blossom buds aborted in the clusters before they opened out. On the other hand, a peculiar checking of the growth resulted in an unusual number of axillary lateral blossom cluster buds being produced on one year wood.

You know, of course, that apple cluster buds are normally produced as terminals on fruit spurs on branches, usually short branches. It might be well to think over your last summer's conditions to see if you cannot find something on which to lay the trouble. Very truly yours,
