tarting; most of the men who go into the mountains after big game are either responsible citizens or have had enough training in woodcraft to be trusted with a match. The danger is far greater from casual tourists who have no experience in camping or in woodlife, and who do not know that a fire will continue to burn if it isn't put out or carefully isolated. The tinder-like condition of the forests prior to the rains, however, made it advisable to consider shutting off the forest privilges for all comers, even the careful men. 
