 It is expected that the rains of this week will restore the hunting calendar to the written and not the personal-law category; that it will so end the fire menace that there will be no need of police interference with the opening of deer season. This will be about the best news of the week, to the sporting public.

Not many hunters are real forest menaces in the way of fire-starting; most of the men who go into the mountains after big game are either responsible citizens or have had enough training in woodcraft to be trusted with a match. The danger is far greater from casual tourists who have no experience in camping or in wood-life, and who do not know that a fire will continue to burn if it isn't put out or carefully isolated. The under-like condition of the forests prior to the rains, however, made it advisable to consider shutting off the forest privileges for all comers, even the careful men. If the order had been issued to close the forests, it would only have saved many a good hunter from getting "skunked" in game; for no hunter on earth could hope to get within shooting range of a deer while the forest was so dry and crackly.
