STOCK MARKET SHOWS STRONG

Little in News to Account Early Reactionary Trend Is Overcome by Remarkable Demonstration

> NEW YORK, Aug. 22. - The stock market today gave another remarkable demonstration of strength, overcoming an early reactionary trend, bringing several new favorites to the fore and carrying more active issues to their highest prices of the year.

Five consecutive days of rising prices had resulted in a weakened position, which the shorts were quick to recognize. Selling pressure began to exert itself as soon as the opening gong rang, and it was given impetus by realizing sales on the part of recent buyers, but a sustained investment demand set in especially in copper, domestic ail, equipment and tobacco shares, which reversed the course of the market and steadied the whole list.

United States Steel corporaion's announcement of an advance of 20 per cent in the wages of day laborers was generally unexpected in view of opposite readjustments in other industries. United States Steel common, which opened at 104 %, or % below last night's final quotation, sold off to 103 7-8 at the close, sympathetic declines taking place n the independent steels.
